### Interview with Supported Internship Coordinator (Year 2) Shaun French *Reported by JHa (Year 1 Intern)*

*"My role at Samee is Supported Internship Co-ordinator for year 1 learners. The year 1's are progressing very well, and they are gaining a deeper understanding of their business model and services. We have been discussing communication skills which include understanding different communication methods and building rapport. We have also done a deep dive into their own business idea and what it means to be self-employed.*

*There has been a lot of good opportunities for the year 1s so far. Just to mention a few, three of our learners went to a Birds of Poole harbour event at Bournemouth University which was about restoration and repopulation of Osprey on the south coast for the first time in 180 years which was quite cool! Two learners, one who is visually impaired and one who is creating braille signs for our Headquarters attended Bournemouth blind society. Finally, our ventriloquist learner had a gig on 29th of November which they had organised themselves with a little help from the Samee charity with their promotion."*



### Interview with Internship Mentor, Gail Parr *Reported by ET (Year 1 Intern)*

**ET:** How long have you worked for SAMEE?

**GP:** I have worked for SAMEE for 4 years on and off, and the mentor role evolved with the launch of the internship.

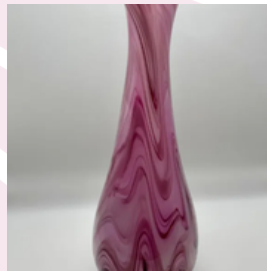


### Spotlight on our Internship Programme

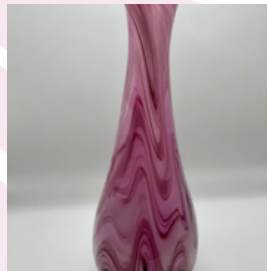
